# Sinaiticism: The Biblical Art

“Tina I notice that you never participate in the birthday and holiday luncheons. Are you a Jehovah’s Witness or Islamic?” Kim asked.

“I am neither, I practice Sinaiticism” Tina responds.

“What is Sinaiticism?” Kim inquires.

“Let me explain,” Tina begins.

The term *Sinaitic* means, “Of, made, or given at Sinai (Webster’s New Twentieth Century Dictionary Unabridged, p.1693, 1983 and 1955). An *Is*m is “A doctrine, system, theory, etc. whose name ends in –ism; (Webster’s New Twentieth Century Dictionary Unabridged, p.973, 1983 and 1955).” We combine the two terms to form Sinaiticism, which is the practice of the laws that were given to Moses on Mt. Sinai. Sinaiticism, the biblical art system, is based upon the 450 commandments or laws of the bible, which are found in the first five books of the bible, known as the Torah. The art of Sinaiticism is the study of the laws and prophecies that occur in the canonized scriptures.

**Exodus 24:3** states And Moses came and told the people all the words of YAH, and all the judgments: and all the people answered with one voice, and said, All the words which YAH hath said will we do. This scripture represents the inception of the Sinaitic Covenant made between YAH, The Father and the sons of Yisrael; and is the genesis of Sinaiticism.

Christianity, described as the teachings of “Jesus”, is a doctrinal system comprised of exegetical passages of the epistles in the New Testament. One of many examples is John 10:30 which states my Father and I are *one*. Christians misconstrue the term “**one**” to claim the Messiah and Father as being the same entity (*homoousios*),



therefore justifying the deification of the Messiah and **not** his Father. This passage is simply classifying the Father and his Son as a unit or group effort. The word one is polysemous, meaning it has multiple meanings.

This Christian interpretation ignores the fact that the word *one* can represent multiple entities such as with Adam and Eve. Adam says in Genesis 2:24 “Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh”.

The Islamic religion spuriously endorses total submission unto Allah, a deity who is supposed to be the god of the Hebrew Torah. Islam’s founder, the prophet Mohammed, often used violence to inculcate doctrine. “Eight years in Medina proved to be sufficient time for Muhammad to rally substantial forces behind his cause. From 624-630, his followers attacked and conquered villages in the regions surrounding Medina” (Dictionary of Cults, Sects, Religions and the Occult, p.140, 1993). Servitude unto a sovereign deity did not and does not require force based upon Sinaitic precepts.



Sabbath convocation, a major distinction of Sinaiticism, is held on Saturday. Additional holy days include: Unleavened Bread Day 1 and Unleavened Bread Day 7, Shavuot/The Feast of Weeks, Shofarim/The Feast of Trumpets, Yom Kippur/Day of Atonement, Sukkot/Tabernacles Day 1 and Tabernacles Day 8, and New Moons. These convocations can be found in Leviticus chapter 23.

“Jesus was a Jew who went up to Jerusalem for the great religious feasts of his people and on the Sabbath regularly attended the synagogue” (The Horizon History of Christianity, p.9, 1964). Although Christianity bases its operation on the teachings of Jesus who observed the Sabbath, yet this religious populous continues to worship on Sunday as instructed by Constantine the Great in 321 A.D.

Christians observe civil holidays such as Christmas, Easter, Thanksgiving, Valentine’s Day, and Halloween. Each of these festivals originated from false gods, which means that the individual is actually venerating a pagan deity (god) which violates the first two commandments of the bible (torah). Islam’s weekly convocation is on Friday. Islam, as Christianity, engages man-made holidays such as Ramadan, Yom Arafat, Laylat Al-Baraa, Eid Al-Adhha, Id al-Fitr.

Another major distinction of Sinaiticism is the adherence to the dietary laws found in Leviticus chapter 11. The dietary laws state that animals such as swine, shellfish and rabbits are unclean and cannot be eaten.

Christianity promulgates that *all* foods are fit for consumption if you pray before you eat them. Islamic doctrine states that swine is forbidden, however under stressful conditions it can be consumed if it is the only food available for consumption. Sinaiticism has no such compromise.

## Kashrut

Sinaiticism is the only doctrinal system in the world that is based upon the laws of the Father, whose correct name is YAH; not “*Jesus*” and not “*Allah*.” He is the chief and final legislator of the law, unlike the religious systems of Christianity and Islam who rely on ecclesiastical counsels and collective agreement to formulate doctrine.



“Sinaiticism is not confusing. The same can not be said for Christianity or Islam, with all do respect. I’ll see you on Saturday, the Sabbath!” Kim said with a smile.

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
